 - 12.1 Robyn Raymond – Adult Education Last week I attended the annual awards ceremony for Literacy Volunteers. One of our students received an award as well as our literacy volunteer, Marlene. I have handed out 2 papers. In light of the most recent news from Verso, we have been feverishly working on employment training opportunities. In partnership with Mt. Blue Adult Education and Foster Tech we will be able to provide the 10 education/skill building opportunities that are on the list I passed out. HVAC is the big one, we are looking to expand this list and continue to take calls from area businesses looking for skilled workers to send their way. Finally the second handout is data from the Department of Education which reflects the top Adult Ed performers in three categories. We were in two of the three. We were #15 of top in academic gain/completions and #8 in post testing out of 74 programs.
