

**WARRANT AND NOTICE OF ELECTION CALLING
REGIONAL SCHOOL UNIT NO. 73
BUDGET REFERENDUM
(20-A M.R.S. §§ 1486 & 1501; Executive Order #56 FY 19/20)**

TO: Kristal Flagg, a resident Regional School Unit No. 73 (the "Regional School Unit") composed of the Towns of Jay, Livermore, and Livermore Falls, State of Maine.

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby ordered to serve upon the municipal clerks of each of the municipalities within the Regional School Unit, namely, the Towns of Jay, Livermore, and Livermore Falls, an attested copy of this warrant and notice of election. Service shall be in hand within three (3) days of the date of this warrant and notice of election. The municipal clerks of the above municipalities shall immediately notify the respective Municipal Officers. The Municipal Officers shall meet forthwith and countersign this warrant and notice of election. The Municipal Officers shall provide below for the respective municipal clerks to post or have posted this warrant and notice of election.

TO: Amanda Allen, Municipal Clerk of Livermore Falls: You are hereby required in the name of the State of Maine to notify the voters of this municipality of the election described in this warrant and notice of election.

TO THE VOTERS OF LIVERMORE FALLS: You are hereby notified that a Regional School Unit Budget Referendum election will be held at the Livermore Falls Town Office, 2 Main Street in the Town of Livermore Falls on Tuesday, August 18, 2020 for the purpose of determining the following articles:

Article 1A: To elect a moderator to preside at the meeting.

Article 1: School Budget. Shall Regional School Unit No. 73 appropriate the sum of **\$20,160,842.01** and raise the sum of **\$10,217,051.72** for the 2020-2021 school budget?
School Board Recommends a "Yes" Vote.

VOTER INFORMATION FOR ARTICLE 1

The Regional School Unit No. 73 school budget submitted in this Article 1 totals \$20,160,842.01. It includes locally raised funds in the amount of \$10,217,051.72, to be assessed in shares to member municipalities in accordance with the RSUs cost sharing formula and state law. The locally raised amount exceeds the State's Essential Programs and Services funding model by \$2,865,140.40. This budget includes these cost centers and amounts:

Article 2: Cost Center Transfers. Shall the School Board of Regional School Unit No. 73 be authorized to transfer amounts exceeding 5% of the total appropriation for any cost center to another cost center or among other cost centers for the 2020-2021 fiscal year, provided that transfers shall not be permitted to increase the authorized total school budget?
School Board Recommends a "Yes" Vote.

Article 3: Food Service Program. Shall Regional School Unit No. 73 be authorized to appropriate **\$844,664.88** for the food service program and raise **\$206,964.87** (\$68,988.29 for each town) as the local share, with authorization to expend any additional, incidental, or miscellaneous receipts in the interest and for the well-being of the food service program?
School Board Recommends a "Yes" Vote.

Article 4: Adult Education Program. Shall Regional School Unit No. 73 be authorized to appropriate **\$387,938.73** for adult education and raise **\$195,000.00** (\$65,000.00 for each town) as the local share, with authorization to expend any additional, incidental, or miscellaneous receipts in the interest and for the well-being of the adult education program?
School Board Recommends a "Yes" Vote.

The voting on Articles 1 through 4 shall be by secret ballot referendum. The polls will be opened immediately after election of the moderator following commencement of the meeting at **12:00 p.m. and closed at 6:00 p.m.**



A person who is not registered as a voter may not vote in any election.


